## Challenge: How can we increase active and sustainable travel before, during, and after LRT construction?

The city of Hamilton will soon begin the implementation of a <u>Light Rail Transit</u> (LRT) system from Eastgate Square to McMaster University, and construction is expected to last a decade. This will inevitably disrupt roads and impact how we travel around our city. In planning for the construction, the City aims to "shift commuters to consider walking, cycling, transit and carpooling."[1] The City also works with community groups to advocate for safer, friendlier, and complete streets focused on active and sustainable modes of transportation.

**More about Hamilton's LRT**: This system will connect key areas, destinations and institutions along Queenston Road, Main Street and King Street, creating a 14 kilometre, 17 stop, multi-modal corridor and an enhanced streetscape. Major arterial roadways, like Cannon Street and Main Street, will likely experience heightened congestion, so alternative modes of transportation will need to be utilized.
